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**SPECIAL MASTER’S SEVENTH SEMI-ANNUAL REPORT  
FOR THE TIME PERIOD OF JULY 1, 2025 TO DECEMBER 31, 2025  
REGARDING THE DEPOSITS, EXPENDITURES AND PAYMENTS TO AND  
FROM THE COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA’S OPIOID FEE FUND**

This is the seventh semi-annual report regarding the deposits, expenditures and payments to and from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania’s Opioid Fee Fund (“Fee Fund”). This report covers the time period of July 1, 2025 to December 31, 2025. This report is being submitted pursuant to the Honorable Barry C. Dozor’s December 1, 2022, “Order Regarding Fee Fund Payments of Vendor Invoices and Reporting Requirements.” The background regarding the creation and administration of the Fee Fund was set forth in the Special Master’s First Semi-Annual Report and will not be repeated. However, a brief summary of developments to date will be provided.

**Wave 1 Settlements**

The fourth of the five annual award payments totaling \$11,336,568.23 (\$5,671,485.81 Contingency Fees and \$5,665,082.42 Agreed Litigation Conduct a/k/a Common Benefit Fees) was paid to the approved law firms between December 19, 2025 – January 7, 2026. In addition, twenty-five percent (25%) of the third of the five annual award payments totaling \$2,834,142.06

(\$1,417,871.45 Contingency Fees and \$1,416,270.61 Agreed Litigation Conduct a/k/a Common Benefit Fees) was also paid to the approved law firms between December 19, 2025 – January 7, 2026. A deposit in the amount of \$9,459,071.19 was made on December 15, 2025 as part of the Wave 1 settlements. We anticipate the final deposit being made in late December 2026 representing the fifth out of five payments for Wave 1 settlements.

### **Wave 2 Settlements**

On November 13, 2024, the Honorable Barry C. Dozor entered an Order Granting Plaintiffs' Motion to Add Funds to the Pennsylvania Opioid Fee Fund pertaining to Wave 2 Settlements. No Wave 2 settlement money has been distributed to date. We have started working on the allocation for the Wave 2 settlements and expect to make payments for cost/expenses and attorney fees in 2026. A deposit in the amount of \$3,360,627.94 was made on December 13, 2024 as part of the Wave 2 settlements representing the first and second payments for Wave 2 settlements. A deposit in the amount of \$1,672,071.94 was made on December 15, 2025 representing the third payment for Wave 2 settlements. We anticipate receiving a deposit in late December 2026 representing the fourth out of five payments for Wave 2 settlements.

### **Deposits, Expenditures and Payments to and From the Fee Fund From July 1, 2025 to December 31, 2025**

After all the December 2025 Wave 1 payments were made, the balance in the Fee Fund was \$5,997,165.97.

### **Deposits**

A deposit to the Fee Fund in the amount of \$11,763,124.53 was received from the Trust on December 15, 2025. This amount is represented to be comprised of \$9,459,017.19 from

Wave 1 settlements, \$1,672,071.94 from Wave 2 settlements, and \$632,035.40 from the Endo bankruptcy.

**Expenditures and Payments From July 1, 2025 to December 31, 2025**

The invoices of the Administrator, approved vendors and Special Master were paid from the Fee Fund during this reporting time period. From July 1, 2025 to December 31, 2025, a total of \$82,010.50 was paid. The payments are broken down as follows: Montgomery McCracken: \$30,190.09 (Wave 1 and 2 services); Law Office of Joseph Tann, PLLC: \$34,000.00 (Wave 1 services); Amy L. Collins PC: \$27,970.00 (Wave 2 services), and Rubris: \$98,500.00 (\$6,000 for Wave 1 and \$92,500.00 for Wave 2 services).

**CONCLUSION**

This semi-annual report is submitted pursuant to Judge Dozor’s December 1, 2022 Order and includes a record of all deposits, payments and expenditures to and from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania’s Opioid Fee Fund from July 1, 2025 to December 31, 2025.
